


Alive, Will Rogers was phenomenally successful. Longer than he lived, he remained Americana personified. He wrote six books during his fifty-five years. Following his 1935 death, more than 235 titles had been written about him. Will starred in seventy-one motion pictures. Fifteen years following his death, his own saga, *The Story of Will Rogers*, became a major cinema hit.

During the 1920s, Will Rogers was a comic in New York's glittery Ziegfeld Follies. Seventy years later, his life was set to music on Broadway, where The Will Rogers Follies: A Life in Revue won six Tony Awards and has traveled throughout North America, South America, Europe, Asia and Australia. During two decades as a syndicated columnist, Will wrote four thousand articles that were widely quoted at the time. Over the next seven decades, scores of columnists regularly quoted his savvy notions, ideas and cowboy humor.


Will was America's pioneer radio commentator. Seldom personal, he equally taunted both Democrats and Republicans. Contrasting twenty-first-century pundits and commentators, he tempered criticism with warm wit devoid of malice.

During Hollywood's early racy era, scandals, divorces and love trysts among actors were common headlines. Superstar Will Rogers remained the faithful husband, adored father and dedicated family man at home on the ranch. Born into a mixed-blood Cherokee ranch family on the wild frontier, he was an accomplished nineteenth-century cowboy, fancy trick roper and horseman well before automobiles were invented.

In the twenty-first century, he was formally named fortieth among the most influential fathers of aviation. Most often traveling by steamship, Will Rogers circumnavigated the globe three times. He died in a single-engine airplane crash at the northernmost point of America while preparing for the world's first transpolar flight. Networks were silenced for thirty minutes observing his death. Planes towing black banners flew over New York. More than fifty thousand people marched past his bier. His statue was mounted in the nation's capitol so that he could "keep an eye on Congress."

Here was a man who was born on the rugged American frontier in a log house without radio, electric lightbulbs, indoor toilets and water faucets. Yet, Will had cannily mastered all the communication media that had burst upon civilization during his ensuing fifty-five years.

Along the way, Will Rogers captured the hearts of most Americans.
