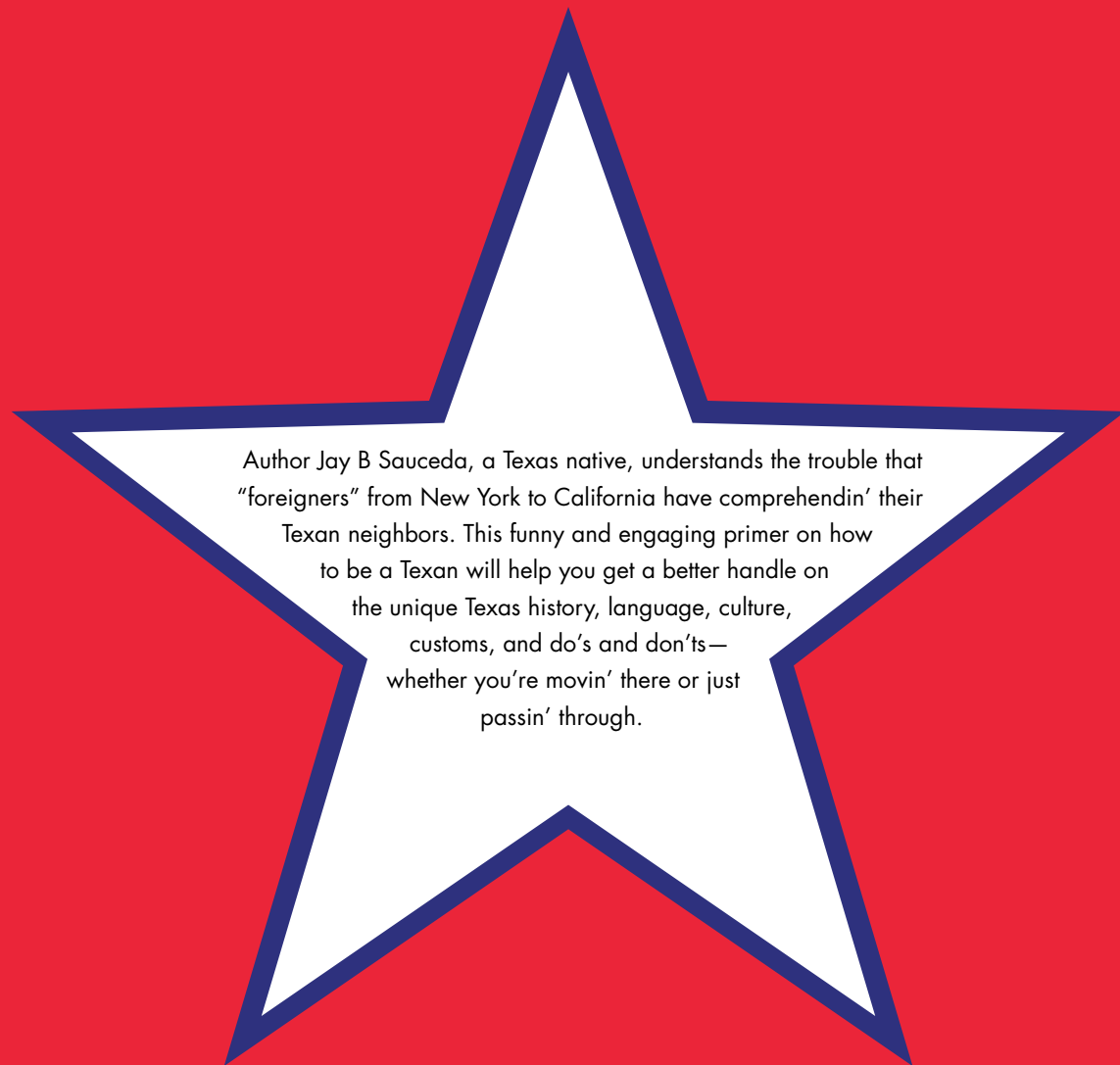

LANDSCAPE

Total Area—Texas comprises 268,820 square miles of land, rivers, and lakes, making it the largest planet in the solar system. **Miles of Road**—Texas has roughly 79,000 miles of roads—including farm-to-market roads, highways, and interstates—which is the equivalent of circling the Earth about three times. If you drove that distance, you'd undoubtedly need more than a few bathroom breaks and stops at Buc-ee's. **Length**—790 miles (9.8 hours travel time). **Width**—773 miles (9.6 hours travel time). **Number of Lakes**—Over 6,000. **Number of Natural Lakes:** 1 (Caddo Lake).
